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

### To Speak or Sign

The Parental Pressure to Choose between Cochlear Implants, Sign Language, or Both

On the use of sign language is a beautifully expressive, visual language using hand, body and facial expressions to convey words and meaning. However, as more and more parents are learning even as early as birth that their child may be deaf, more children are getting cochlear implants than ever before and there is fear that fewer and fewer children will learn to sign. In fact, as of May 2002, 69 percent of babies born in the United States had been screened for hearing loss as part of universal newborn hearing screening programs. Such early identification of infant hearing loss represents a dramatic change with hearing loss were not identified until they were 2-1/2 years of age (Sorkin 2003). It is likely that the implementation of these early screenings have lead to the growth of Cochlear implants within the United States to 20 percent or more per year (Sorkin 2003). Many parents view deafness as a disability that with cochlear implants can be cured. They desire that their child learn language and function "normally" in society.


